NEW MEMBERS

Sudbury native VIOLA BURKE arrived in North Bay when she was just a year old, but didn't seriously take up competitive sports for almost 40 years. Viola started running marathons in 1992 and has competed in some 20 grueling races around Ontario and in six States. The same year she started to take part in Triathlons (swim, bike, run) and she has represented Canada in her age class in four ITU World Championships. In 2002, in Mexico, she was the third Canadian woman to finish the Cancun World event. She has competed in the Ironman Worlds in Hawaii on two occasions; in 2003 she was 25th in the 50-54 age bracket after having placed first in the same category at Ironman Brazil to qualify for Hawaii. In 1997 she also competed at Hawaii after having placed 2nd in the 45-49 division in Ironman Canada. In 1999 Burke was 7th in 45-49 in Ironman USA. In 2001 she took 6th in Ironman Europe in that same bracket.

Currently idled by back surgery, Burke had five age class first place finishes in various events, including triathlons and road races in 2003. She has also won five different age class events in 2002, including the Ontario Triathlon Championship at Hamilton. A teacher at Laurentian Public School, she has been coaching cross country running, skiing and track and field for a number of years, and is an Alpine instructor at Jackpine Hill.

North Bay native MIKE MITCHELL began playing football at NBCI&VS and in 1955 played the line as the Trojans took part in the "Red Feather" event. For two seasons he was an offensive lineman with the NORFU Roughriders, as well as playing high school ball. He played intercollegiate CIAU football with the Waterloo Lutheran Golden Hawks (Wilfred Laurier) and earned CFL tryouts with Hamilton and Montreal.

In 1965 he became a part time coach with the Hawks and was with them as they qualified for the College Bowl (Vanier Cup) final in 1966 and 1968. Returning to North Bay, he continued to scout for the university and sent a number of local players to the CIAU, including Gord McColeman and Larry Simpson (who both played later in the CFL), as well as John Cater, Ted Passmore, Clarke Eady, Blake Blundell, Tom Balfe and J.P. Brais.

Mitchell coached football in the NDA with Algonquin and with the NFC Ti' Cats in the late sixties and served on the Ti' Cat executive as well as helping fund raise. Over his short lifespan he worked in virtually all aspects of the game. He was a capable softball player, pitching in several teams in the GFA during the fifties and sixties.

Mitchell died in a car accident in 1973. The local football recognition award, which started that same year, was originally named in his memory.

NEW MEMBERS

P.E.I.-born LIONEL MURPHY served in the military for over 30 years, seeing action in WWII and Korea. Retiring in North Bay, he was a founding member of the North Bay Skeet and Trap Club, volunteering years of executive and fundraising work. He began to shoot competitively in 1991 at the age of 66 and won the Canadian Senior Veteran (70 years of age and up) Trap Shooting Championship in 2003 when he was 78.

He has won numerous age class championships in events in Ontario, Quebec, Michigan, Ohio, Florida and Kentucky. He captured Ontario Veteran's (65 and over) titles in 1991 and '93, and took Provincial Senior Veteran's crowns in 1997, '98, '99 and 2003. In the 1999 event he fired a category record 199 out of 200 and he duplicated that score in a competition in 2002 at St. Thomas when he was 77. Murphy won a provincial Senior Veteran's Trap Singles Championship in 1998, as well as capturing three Ohio State Veteran's titles ('91, '92, '93), a Michigan Grand Lakes event, and two Quebec Provincial age class awards in 1994 and '96. The various state and provincial competitions often draw 6000 entries, with as many as 300 in a category. Currently he shoots out of the Rock Cut Shooting and Sportsman's Club in Powassan.

DARREN TURCOTTE was born in Boston, Mass. in 1968 and grew up in North Bay, where he started to play hockey at the age of five. He spent six seasons in the AAA program with Pinehill Coffee Shop, coached by his father (Butch). In 1982 they won the NOHA Bantam title and were provincial finalists. In 1984 he scored over 60 goals and led the team to the NOHA, Ontario and Canadian Midget hockey titles.

A third round pick of the Centennials in 1984, he played four seasons in the OHL, scoring at least 30 goals and carding at least 30 assists each season. He tallied 128 goals and listed 278 points in 211 regular season games, and in 40 playoff matches added another 18 goals. He played for the United States in two World Junior Championship tournaments.

Drafted by the New York Rangers in 1986, he played 635 NHL games with six teams over 11 seasons, scoring 195 regular season goals and carding 411 points; a power play specialist early in his career, he potted 58 PPG. He topped rookie charts by scoring 32 times in his initial campaign and 113 in his first four years. Converted to a defensive specialist he notched 11 SHG but suffered a broken foot and injuries to both knees. Along with the Rangers, he played for Hartford, Winnipeg, San Jose, St. Louis and Nashville. He continues to reside near Nashville and has begun coaching minor hockey.
