NEW MEMBERS

ERNIE FOLLIS was born in Owen Sound and was 30 years of age when he arrived in North Bay. Over the next 15 years, until his untimely death in 1961, he played a major role in this city in fastball and hockey and as a citizen and businessman. Sporting and business groups often called upon his calm, levelheaded approach and good judgment. In 1960 he was the co-chair of the Committee for Sunday Sport which successfully lobbied for paid admission for Sunday afternoon sports in the municipal election of that year. In 1954 he was the chair of the Community Building Advisory Committee, which shaped the plans for Memorial Gardens.

He was one of the co-founders of the Northland Fastball Association and served as NFA President in 1952 and '53. Five years later he was named a Life Member of the regional organization. Locally he played Industrial League ball, served on the Gateway Fastball Association Executive and was President in 1950. He also spent a number of years on the executive of the North Bay & District Hockey Association, including a term as President and generally worked for and supported amateur sport every chance he got.

Follis also served as President of the Chamber of Commerce and worked toward the founding of a university here. The NDA Senior Basketball trophy is named in his honour as was the NFA's Men's Intermediate B Award. Ernie Follis made major contributions to North Bay as a sportsman and as a citizen.

North Bay native TOM GRAHAM has been involved in football for some forty years as player, coach or executive. He started playing the game in high school in 1964 with the Algonquin Composite Trojans – helping them to an NDA title in 1967 as center and defensive tackle. He spent a dozen years playing with the North Bay entry in the Northern Football Conference, starting while he was still in high school, and was named an NFC All Star in 1971 as a defensive end. Attending the University of Guelph he played intercollegiate football with the Gryphons from 1971 through 1975. Although drafted by the Toronto Argos he continued to play in the NFC and started coaching the local entry in 1974. He handled the Ti Cats for seven seasons, the Northmen for three and then took the Bulldogs reins in 1992, '95 and '97. He has acted as the local team's General Manager for a total of 16 years since 1978. He has coached at the high school level (NDA) for a total of 26 seasons with Chippewa, Widdifield and West Ferris. He started the North Bay Youth Football camp in 1999 and was instrumental in organizing the local youth football program. His energy and hard work helped the local NFC entry survive on numerous occasions and he has always been willing to step in and help the NDA program. Football in North Bay is thriving thanks in no small part to Tom Graham.

North Bay native STEVE OMISCHL competed in the 2002 Winter Olympics as a member of Canada's Freestyle Skiing team and thus qualifies as an automatic member of the North Bay Sports Hall of Fame.

At the age of 15 he attended a Lake Placid "water ramp" camp and became hooked on Freestyle skiing. He competed at the National Championships and at various NorAm events from 1997 and in 1999 was named to the Canadian Freestyle team where he won male Rookie of the Year honours on the World Cup circuit. He took silver in his first World Cup event late in '99 and he won his first Canadian Aerials Freestyle title at Mont Gabriel Quebec in 2001. Named to the Olympic team the next season he qualified for the aerials final at Salt Lake City and finished in 11th spot. He finished fourth overall in the World Cup Aerials series in both 2001 and 2002 and in 2003 won his first two World Cup events.

In his 5th season on the Canadian team (2003-'04) he exploded out of the gate, winning the opening World Cup aerials competition in Australia and before the season was over had won six times and placed second on three occasions. Omischl won the Freestyle World Cup individual male Aerials championship and the accompanying crystal globe by more than 200 points. He placed second overall in World Cup Aerials this year and in 2003. This spring Omischl won the Mens Aerials World Championship in Finland after finishing third in the same event in 2003. Winning the World title automatically qualified him for the 2006 Winter Olympics in Italy.

NORTH BAY SPORTS HALL OF FAME NEW MEMBERS

SCOTT PATTERSON was born in Pembroke and arrived in North Bay in 1993 already the holder of impressive curling credentials, having skipped a team to the Ontario Schoolboy crown in 1986 and winning the provincial intercollegiate title while attending Laurentian University. While curling out of Sudbury he also placed third in the Canadian Mixed and was named All Star skip.

Before his untimely passing in an auto accident in 2004 Patterson had established himself as one of the finest skips and curlers to ever play out of the North Bay Granite Club and the first local skip to qualify rinks for the Brier (Canadian Men's Curling Championship) on two occasions.

In 1994 Patterson skipped a local rink to the Northern Ontario Championship and a berth in the Brier for the first time in 39 years. The foursome recorded a 7-4 record that year and five years later the same quartet took another Northern Ontario title and recorded a 6-5 record in the Brier. While skipping out of North Bay Patterson qualified for the Northern Ontario Provincial Men's finals six times ('94, '95, '98, '99, '01 & '03) after having won at the local and regional (NOCA) levels. In 1997 he curled on the front end with Russ Howard in both the Ontario Men's Championship and the Olympic trials. Three times Patterson skipped rinks to the championship in the highly competitive North Bay Granite Club Jamaica Bonspiel against elite World Curling Tour fields ('96, '98 & '01).

North Bay born KEN RICHARDSON played hockey at various levels, including the NHL, for almost 25 years and then coached young people for some 15 seasons. Richardson was a hard checking defensive player with an outstanding work ethic who developed into a superb penalty killer. He learned his skills at local rinks and then played three seasons with Peterborough in the OHL before attending Laurentian University, playing intercollegiate hockey and earning his first degree, which he had started at Trent in Peterborough. Invited to the St. Louis Blues NHL camp in 1973 he was signed to a three year pro contract and wound up playing the next seven seasons in the International League with Columbus, in the Central league with Denver, Oklahoma City, Kansas City and Salt Lake and in the American League with Providence. He also had three cracks at the NHL with the Blues where he carded 21 points in 49 games.

Retiring from pro ranks in 1980 he returned home and obtained his Bachelor of Education at Nipissing. He started to coach in 1981 with the OCAA Canadore Panthers and worked with Chippewa of the NDA. In 1990 he started to coach in the local minor system and over the next 13 seasons won a trio of NOHA championships in consecutive seasons. He coached at various levels from novice to atom to peewee, bantam and midget. A teacher at Fricker School for 14 years he has maintained a love of the outdoors and has organized canoe trips to Algonquin Park since he started teaching.
