NORTH BAY SPORTS HALL OF FAME ~ NEW MEMBERS

GUY BLANCHARD was born in Sudbury and arrived in North Bay at the age of 17 (1976) to play with the North Bay Junior Trappers in the POHA. After anchoring the Trapper defence for two seasons, he enrolled at Western Michigan University where he played until 1980. Returning to North Bay, he began what turned out to be a better than 25 year coaching career, serving as an assistant to Don (Butch) Turcotte with Pinehill Coffee Shop. That culminated with the winning of the Canadian Midget Hockey Championship and the Air Canada Cup in 1984. The following season he was recruited by Bert Templeton and spent the next two seasons as an assistant with the OHL North Bay Centennials before advancing to the Sudbury Wolves where he was the General Manager and Coach for the 1986 - '87 campaign. He then spent a few months in 1988 as an assistant coach with the Guelph Platers before returning to North Bay. In 1990 Blanchard revived tier two junior in the North Bay area by purchasing a Northern Ontario Junior Hockey Association franchise and placing a team in Powassan. Known as the Passports in 1990 and the Hawks for the following three seasons, the club won three NOJHA championships, two OHA titles and twice competed in the Dudley Hewitt Cup tournament. In 1994 he moved the franchise to Sturgeon Falls where the Lynx operated until 2002 when the team was moved to North Bay to fill the void after the departure of the Centennials. The North Bay Skyhawks won three more NOJHL titles and competed in three more Hewitt Cup events. In 2005 the tournament was held in North Bay with the Skyhawks reaching the final. Blanchard served on the NOJHL Board for 20 years until he sold his franchise in 2010. In 2007 he was presented with the Ontario Junior Hockey Award for his many years of service to junior hockey as player, coach, general manager, owner and administrator. As well as working at the junior level, Blanchard was a minor hockey coach for some 15 years.

PAUL CHESSER is a native of Ottawa whose military pilot father was posted to North Bay in 1977. Paul played golf, fastball and hockey in his youth but it was football where he really shone. Attending St. Joseph's Scollard Hall he benefitted from the coaching acumen of Mike Doyle and Bill Hartley as he helped the Bears to undefeated seasons, NDA Senior titles and Poupore Cups (NOSSA) in 1986 and 1987. Bears team captain in 1987 and '88, Chesser was recruited by a number of Canadian Universities and in 1989 he enrolled at Concordia where he played for five seasons. He cracked the varsity lineup on special teams and as a backup defensive end in his first year, and for the next four seasons he started at defensive end. In his senior year, 1993, he was chosen team captain and led the Stingers to the Ontario-Quebec Conference championship while being named Conference Outstanding Lineman and an Ontario-Quebec All Star. His season long excellence led voters from across Canada to award him the J.P. Metras Trophy as the country's Outstanding University Lineman and to the All Canadian First Team as a defensive end. He was also named Concordia's Male Athlete of the Year. In 1994, as one of the top 40 CFL prospects, he attended a Canadian Football League evaluation camp where he was deemed to be a step too slow for defensive end and a bit small for defensive tackle. Tossing his thoughts of pro football aside, he returned to graduate studies at Concordia and became the Stingers defensive coordinator. He served the school in that position for the next six seasons, recruiting a number of North Bay players to the Concordia fold, including Greg and Jason Casey. In 1998 the Stingers led the nation in defence and reached the Vanier Cup final. The following year Chesser retired from the game to work for Concordia Advancement and he is now employed by Carleton University as Chief Development Officer.

PENNY LECOUR is a native of Whitehorse, Yukon and arrived in North Bay in 1966 as part of a military family. Graduating from North Bay Normal School in 1969 she has taught at the Elementary level since 1973 and has also coached soccer, volleyball and softball.

Penny was 20 years of age when she began coaching swimming in 1967 and over the succeeding forty plus years she has been a lifeguard, swim instructor, examiner, area supervisor and area swim chairperson. She has taught at Champlain Park, the Cove, Silver & Olmsted beaches, the YMCA and CFB. She has impacted many hundreds of swimmers in an area stretching from North Bay to Temagami, Sturgeon Falls and Powassan.

Since 1973 she has trained most of the lifeguards in the city as well as being responsible for the certification of the majority of the swim instructors in this district. For almost 15 years she has been a volunteer coach with the CFB Thunderbirds swim team and her enthusiasm and energy has played a role in the development of the team and of the young swimmers involved. Over the years she has worked with just about anyone in this area who has been involved in swimming; as well she has coached or instructed many elite athletes including Nancy Olmsted, Julia Rivard, Blaine Schmidt, Mike O'Shea, Graham Cobb and Jeff Hibbard.

She is certified with the Canadian Red Cross, Royal Lifesaving Society and Swim Canada, is a level 1 coach, and has been honoured with the Ontario Jubilee Award and the Commonwealth Honour Award for leadership and excellence of service. Penny Lecour's name is synonymous with swimming in North Bay and district.

NORTH BAY SPORTS HALL OF FAME ~ NEW MEMBERS

HARRY J. REYNOLDS was born in North Bay in 1892. He played high school hockey and went on to attend the University of Toronto where he played Intercollegiate for three seasons and was team captain for two. On graduating he came back north to article for a local law firm and play Senior hockey with the North Bay Wanderers as they won the International League Eastern Division title and reached the overall league final in 1913. The next season North Bay entered the Eastern division of the New Ontario Hockey League and Reynolds played a key role as the yellow and black again won the Eastern crown and went on to defeat the Sault in the league final. 1914-15 saw Reynolds playing with Toronto Victorias in the Ontario Senior League and the following season he moved on to the OHA Senior A Toronto Rowing Club while taking law courses at Osgoode Hall. WWI was raging in Europe and Reynolds joined the 228th Battalion and played with their Senior A club. His talents impressed the brass and he was promoted to the 228th National Hockey Association Team (Professional - later the National Hockey League). He scored five goals (including a hat trick) in his first four games before being called overseas with the 228th where Sgt. Major Reynolds took part in several of the major battles of the War (Ypres, Passchendaele, the Somme). Returning from Europe he graduated from Osgoode Hall in 1919 with a law degree - reportedly the first North Bay native to do so. Finding work in Timmins he coached the Timmins Juniors for two seasons before returning to his home town to practice law. He coached the Junior Trappers to the NOHA Junior A championship (Copeland Cup) in 1926 and spent a number of years on the North Bay Hockey Association Executive and helped it survive during difficult economic times. A lifetime sports fan, the former hockey and lacrosse player supported various civic organizations. He was appointed a Judge in 1958 and the H.J. Reynolds trophy for contribution to hockey was instituted in 1975.

MIKE UMPHREY was born in Haileybury and before he arrived in North Bay to attend Cambrian College (now Canadore) in 1970 he had already made his mark in northern sporting circles as he had spent several years fulfilling managerial duties with the famed Campsall Electric fastball club as well as managing a Haileybury midget hockey team. At Cambrian he was in the original Recreation Leadership course, helped manage the OCAA Maroons hockey club and served on the Student's Council.

In 1974 he joined the sports staff of the North Bay Nugget and for the next 32 years (until 2007) he covered local and regional sports for the newspaper while writing "Just Like Mike" columns which were well thought out and to the, often controversial, point. During his lengthy reporting career Umphrey spent most of his spare time doing volunteer work in curling, softball and golf. A curler himself he was President of the North Bay Granite Club (1989-'92), twice President of the Northern Ontario Curling Association and was a two year head of the Ontario Curling Federation (now Curl Ontario). He served a year as prexy of the Canadian Curling Reporters Association and at the Granite Club he spent 15 years on the Jamaica Bonspiel Committee as well as serving on a number of host committees for various regional and provincial playdowns from 1980 to 2000.

In softball he was a team manager or coach for GMFA and Men's League teams for some 15 years, coaching Fraser Tavern to back to back OASA Ontario Intermediate AA titles in 1985 and '86. He managed teams to OASA finals in 1973 and '75 and to a pair of World Oldtimer titles. He was a two term President of the Northland Softball Association. Publicity Director of the Northern Golf Association for 15 years, he served on the North Bay Golf Club Board and has been a starter at the club for several years.


