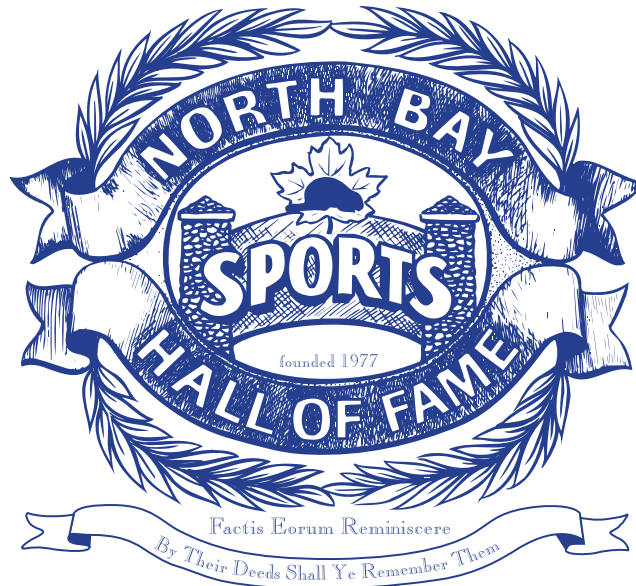

NICKI CHRETIEN-MILLS

At a very young age, Nicki's involvement in the sport of gymnastics started at the YMCA. With the help of the Y Program Director, Nicki saw a need for an enhancement to the basic program that was being offered and she was given additional space and time for the 7 kids that were part of that inaugural program. From those humble beginnings and 50 years later, we honour her tonight.

Although her involvement in the sport as a competitor was limited, Nicki has touched all the bases with regard to the growth and development of the sport at the local, provincial and national levels.

Her coaching career saw her have a significant impact on a multitude of athletes and the success that they attained is exemplified by the accomplishments of two of her prize athletes; Robyn and Erin Grigg who attained success from the local level through to the international level.

Her coaching career commenced in 1975, as a youth leader with the YMCA, which led to her having an integral role in the founding of the Apollo Gymnastics Club; a club she was part of for 20 years in a variety of roles. Branching out, she formed North Bay Gymtrix; a program she has been involved with from 1998 to the present. Along with her club duties, she also served as Team Ontario Coach for the 2003 Las Vegas tour and the 2008 National Championships.

As an official, from 1977 -1992 she was a national level artistic judge, a NCCP Learner Facilitator for 32 years and a competition convenor for 31 years.

At the executive level, Nicki has served her sport in a variety of roles including numerous positions on the Gymnastics Ontario Board of Directors for 32 years and the Northern Region Executive of Gymnastics Ontario for 29 years. In addition to her provincial involvement, Nicki was a member of the Gymnastics Canada working group for Long Term Athlete Development and the Business of Gymnastics subcommittee.

Her contribution to her sport has been recognized through notable awards including numerous prestigious Gymnastics Awards for her contribution to the growth and development of the sport as well as her leadership, mentoring and dedication to the sport.

In 2002, she was the recipient of the Syl Apps Volunteer Achievement Award as part of the Ontario Sport Awards program.

Later this year, she will receive the Gymnastics Ontario "Gold Sapphire Crystal" pin recognizing 50 years of involvement in the sport.

A YMCA kid, with a vision, turned participation in the sport of gymnastics at the recreational level into a career that had a significant impact on athletes at all levels of competition.

PETER MOFFAT

Peter Moffat's career can be best described as being in the right place at the right time. Having lived in numerous locations over an extended period of time, it was his stop in Chicago that provided numerous opportunities for Peter that lead to him being honoured here tonight. It was his background as a hockey player that had a significant impact on his involvement in the sport. There was a need for a person with some hockey knowledge to assist develop a program for on- ice hockey officials. Seeing a larger need, Peter played a significant role in the development of the overall program that introduced hockey to the area. Peter played an instrumental role in the development, training and recruitment that help build a stable of on-ice officials for an area known as the North Shore of Chicago along with the development of the overall program for the area. His efforts did not go unnoticed as the, then referee in chief for the National Hockey League, Vern Buffey, assisted Peter's efforts to develop the local program and through this relationship Peter progressed through the officiating ranks and ultimately was invited to join the staff of the NHL for 5 years followed by 4 years in the WHA.

Following and injury that ended his on ice career, Peter's work with the Tim Horton's Children's Foundation, provided an opportunity to return to North Bay and open his own Tim Horton's franchises.

Under the philosophy of you have to give to get and his passion for the growth and development of programs and services for people of all ages and abilities, Peter lent his time, talent and treasurer to numerous fundraising events in and about North Bay. Through his leadership, numerous programs and services have been able to sustain their services and, in many cases, enhance them. A prime example is that regardless of the sport, many young athletes got their start in sport through the "TIM BITS" program.

He also gave of his time to the North Bay Golf and Country Club where he served on the board for 10 years with 4 years as President.

MEGAN STACEY MANNING

Megan Stacey Manning was cut from her grade 8 volleyball team, but in her first year at Widdifield High School, she was invited to try out for the volleyball team because as she said "I was the tallest girl in grade 9"! Her high school career saw her lead her Widdifield team to an OFSAA gold medal in 2001 as well as being named Female Athlete of the Year in 2000 & 2001. In 2004, she set the record for the most points per game average at 6.7.

Moving on to Nipissing University, Megan placed her name in the record books in her rookie year setting three OCAA records, including most points in a season (301), most points in a match (31) and best points per game average (6.7 PPG), the latter two records still stand.

In 2005, Megan broke two Ontario Colleges Athletic Association volleyball records setting a new record for most kills in a season with 250, erasing the previous record of 247. She also beat her own record for total offensive points in a season by compiling 308 offensive points during the 2004-05 season.

In 2007, her high level of play was once again recognized as she was named to the CCAA All Canadian volleyball All Star team for the 4th consecutive year. Over those four seasons, she has left 7 OCAA scoring records in her wake including the all-time scoring record. It was during that final year that she lead Nipissing to a 14-0 record and its first provincial championship.

In her four years at Nipissing, she amassed 1028 points for 5th overall and ranks fourth in kills with 821 in OCAA rankings.

MEGAN STACEY MANNING (CONT'D)

Her resume truly speaks to her abilities in the sport of volleyball.

- 2000 & 2001 – Widdifield High School Female Athlete of the Year
- 2004 - 2006 - OCAA Women's Volleyball Player of the Year
- 2003 – 2007 – Nipissing University Female Athlete of the Year
- 2003 – 2007 – Nipissing University Volleyball Most Valuable Player
- 2003 – 2007 – OCAA All Star
- 2006 – 2007 – OCAA Athlete of the Year
- 2006 – 2007 – OCAA Championship Most Valuable Player

Described by one of her coaches as a truly gifted player who, due to her outstanding ability saw teams lay out their strategy focusing on her. In spite of their best laid plans, her play allowed her to be the best middle blocker in Nipissing University history and ranks her with the best in OCAA competition. Along with her athletic ability, her leadership and team first attitude contributed greatly to her teams' successes.

Forgoing scholarship offers from USA colleges, Megan returned to North Bay where she followed her dreams of becoming a nurse.

Her decision to return home to Nipissing University served her well and served the Nipissing University volleyball program well with the culmination of her athletic career being recognized tonight.

DAVID NIGHBOR

From what started out as a family activity, David Nighbor's cross country skiing career grew to a level few local skiers have attained. Commencing with his high school career, his status as an elite skier grew as he progressed through the ranks from Chippewa High School to the Ontario Junior Development Team followed by selection to the Ontario Elite Winter Racing Team. His accomplishments at those levels saw him advance to the Canadian Junior National team from 2001-2004 and ultimately from 2004-2009 as a member of the Canadian National Ski team.

Over that period of time, David orchestrated an impressive resume that included:

- 4-time NDA, NOSSA and OFSAA Ski Champion – 1999-2002
- Canadian Junior National Ski Championships – 11 golds, 2 silver, 1 bronze
- North American Canada Cup – 8 golds, 3 silver
- 2007 – 5 consecutive NORAM victories leading to gold at the Canadian Ski Championships
- International stage – 2007 – under 23 world championships – 18th
- World Cup races – 32nd, 33rd, 37th
- 2007 senior world championships – 51st
- 2008 – European Cup – 2nd
- The penultimate accomplishment of being named as an alternate member of Team Canada at the Torino Winter Olympics in 2006.

In summary, during his career, David competed at the national level, he had top 10 finishes in 18 of the 26 events he competed in; a top 10 overall percentage of 69%. On the World Cup stage, he competed in 11 events with a best finish of 29th.

At the OFSAA level, he had 14 - 1st place finishes and for good measure, he threw in a few NOSSA track and field top finishes as well.

David Nighbor's accomplishments speak volumes to the unlimited opportunities a strong local club with solid coaching can provide to young athletes. To his credit, David Nighbor developed a passion and commitment to the sport of Cross-country skiing that took him to the pinnacle of this sport and made him an automatic inductee into the North Bay and Area Sports Hall of Fame.

MELISSA (LADOUCEUR) PARKS

A family decision to re-locate to North Bay opened up a whole new interest in a sporting activity that Melissa Park had never really been exposed to. In order to enhance her physical abilities in the sports of hockey and soccer, Melissa took part in a conditioning camp organized by the Norseman and Valkyries Clubs in 1999. Later that year, she was exposed to a number of barbell movements and she immediately portrayed outstanding speed, timing and flexibility. She was hooked and became a full member of the program. In 2000 and 2001, she won gold medals at numerous events in the 44 and 48 kilo class.

2002 was a breakthrough year for her as she won the 48 kilo title at the Canadian Juniors and she followed that up going undefeated while setting a new provincial junior record in the 44 kilo class.

2003 saw her reach another milestone winning the Canadian juniors, being ranked #1 in the Commonwealth rankings and ultimately being named to the Canadian Pan-American Youth Cup team which saw her once again capture gold in the 48 kilo class.

Following her capturing of the Canadian Junior title once again in 2004, she won the Ontario Seniors meeting the qualification standard to progress to the Canadian Seniors where, as a 17 year old, she became the youngest competitor to ever win the Canadian Championship. She repeated those feats again in 2005.

All told, Melissa captured 16 golds at the provincial and national level while setting provincial junior and senior level records in three weight categories – 44, 48 and 53 kilos.

From her involvement in the sport of weightlifting, she went on to secure post - secondary education in Strength and Conditioning, Bachelor of Physical Health and Education and now teaches at the local level.
